SUPPLEMENTARY ROUTE ORDER.

(This Order is to be delivered to the Commanding Officer of the Ship on arrival at the destination, and is to be attached to Form S. 542 if any travelling expenses are claimed.)

You are to proceed by the route shown overleaf to Chatham

in charge of Party as per list

furnished you, and report as detailed.

The men are clearly to understand that during the whole of the journey they are in all respects considered as being on board their Ship, and any offence committed by them will be dealt with as if it actually occurred on board.

The men are not to leave the Railway Station or go into the Refreshment Rooms without permission.

Arrangements have been made for meals to be provided for the party at

These are not to be paid for, but a receipt for the number of meals served is to be given on the attached Navy Meal Order(s) (Form D.N.A. No. 899).

You are to take particular care to see that meals are supplied according to standard. If there is any cause of complaint it should be noted briefly on the Meal Order before it is surrendered to the Refreshment Contractor, and a report furnished to the Commanding Officer of the Ship or Depot on completion of the journey.

The constitution of the present full standard meal (1s. 6d.) is as follows:-

- (a) 1 meat sandwich (meat 2 ozs.); or 1 meat pie (about 6 ozs.).
- (b) 1 apple, orange or banana, one piece of cake or bun and 1 small roll with butter or 2 slices of bread and butter.
- (c) 1 sausage or 2 ozs. of cheese.
- (d) 1 pint of tea or coffee; or (during legal hours only) $\frac{1}{2}$ pint of ale.

Meal Orders are not to be used other than for food and beverages, including intoxicants within the limit prescribed.

Chief Petty Officers, being exempt from the Meal Order system, should make their own arrangements for meals, and on arrival on board their respective ships, should claim Subsistence Allowance in accordance with the scale shown in note overleaf.
